Florencia Peña is Professor of Anthropology at the National School of Anthropology and History in Mexico City. She holds degrees in anthropology from the Escuela Nacional and in social medicine from the Universidad Autónoma Metropolitana. Her PhD is in sociocultural anthropology from the University of Florida. She is the author of the first book on workplace mobbing published in Mexico, *Cuando el trabajo nos castiga. Debates sobre el mobbing en México* (Mexico and Barcelona, 2007). She is well known in the Hispanic world for her analyses of violence and *acoso moral* [moral harassment] in the workplace and beyond.

Professor Peña's lecture is the third guest lecture on workplace mobbing supported by a bequest to the University of Waterloo from the estate of Hector Hammerly, late Professor of Applied Linguistics at Simon Fraser University. The bequest is administered by Kenneth Westhues, Professor of Sociology. The earlier lectures were by Joan Friedenberg, Professor of Bilingual Education at Florida Atlantic University, in April of 2008, and Hugo Meynell, retired Professor of Religious Studies at the University of Calgary, in November of 2008.
